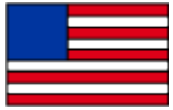

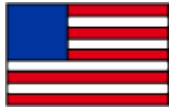

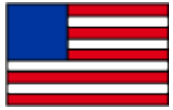
IN GENERAL

1. This is where the **shared data** of all the NUs of tNN are placed and made accessible.
2. The meeting notes of the individual NUs, the Work Group reports, copies of the Information Dispatches, Policy Directives, statistical polling data, and all the rest – **all are here**.
3. But this information is **decentralized**. It's in the publicly accessible multitude of NU web sites.
4. **Access**, also, is decentralized. The NUs have their own menus, lists, and (eventually) search engines.



DATA in the NUs

1. **Each NU keeps** its: meeting notes, its Work Group reports, copies of its Information Dispatches and Policy Directives, its statistical polling data, and all else in its web site DB
2. tNN is ‘**open.**’ That means ALL this data is open to any entity accessing each NUs web site.
3. Each NU maintains **its own DB**. That means it backs it up periodically so it doesn’t lose its content.
4. Its website **data access code**, is developed by itself, or is obtained from other NUs, or from the Open Source people.



How Should the NIN be Used?

1. Each NU, of course, keeps its NUs internal records, reports, meeting notes, work group reports, etc. for **its own internal use** – as one would expect.
2. Any other NU or other **entity can copy** whatever data is in any NUs DB – with the restrictions that it cannot use that data for commercial purposes – to make money.
3. Nor can any entity **modify and republish** that data without identifying its source and revealing how it modified it.
4. Other NUs and entities **can copy** data from another NU for the purposes of ensuring that the data is not lost, or for inclusion in new data, criticisms, broadcast, etc.
